

The new £14.3m Calderwood Primary School was completed for West Lothian Council **on budget and 5 weeks early**, in September 2021.

Calderwood Primary School is located in East Calder, in the new Calderwood development - one of West Lothian Council's Core Development areas. The school has been designed to be built in two phases, the first phase provides a two-stream primary, accommodating 462 pupils with an early years facility accommodating 128 children. As the masterplan build out develops, there will be a requirement for a future second phase to be added to the school. This has already been factored into the design, future proofing the project.

The site for the new school is at the heart of the Calderwood masterplan development, located adjacent to a new village square (yet to commence) which will consist of retail / housing and mixed-use development. The school forms one edge to the village square and the design was influenced by a necessity for the school building to fulfil the role of a (central) community orientated public building. The school will be a significant public face at the heart of the new civic square and Calderwood settlement and will symbolise a high level of investment in the education for the new population of school pupils, providing a twenty first century contemporary building for the emerging and growing Calderwood population.

The design of the new school follows on from West Lothian Council's award winning West Calder High School which had a 'learning without walls' approach, which was developed to assist specific teaching methodologies, pedagogy and embraces open collaborative learning environments.
